



## Winter Skin Care

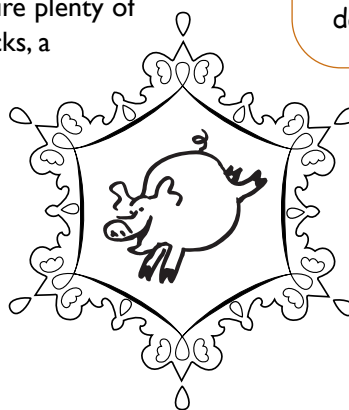

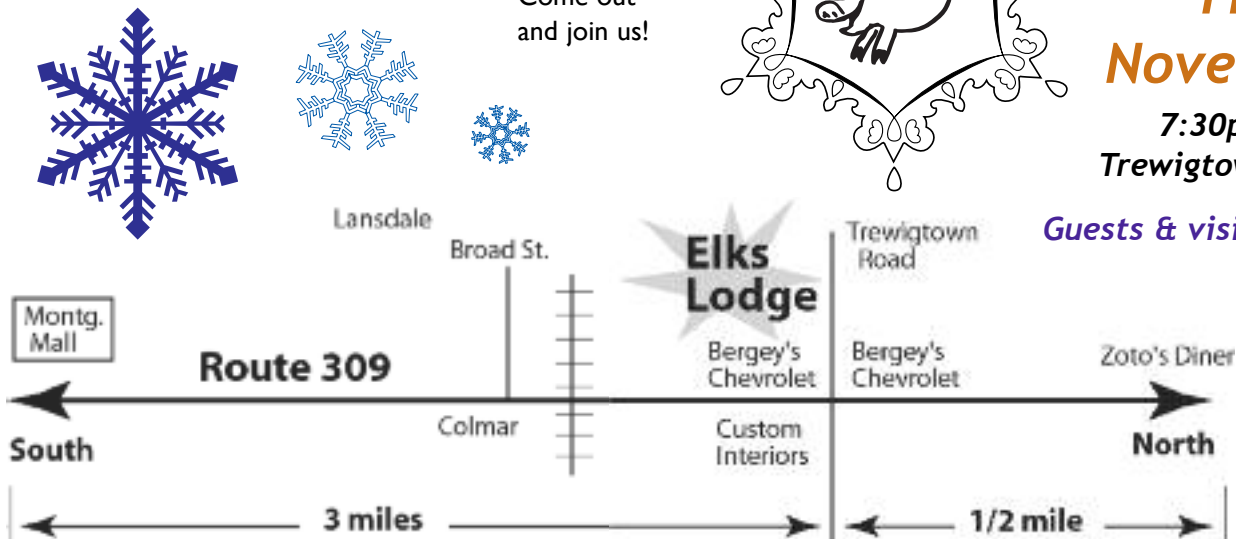

## In Remembrance ...

Sadly, we must share the news of the sudden passing of NPSC's President, Suzanne Hartley, who lost her year-long battle with cancer on October 8, 2014.

Suzanne joined North Penn Ski Club back in 2003, when she signed up to learn to ski during EPSC's Monday night lesson program at Spring Mountain. Bitten by the skiing bug (big time), Suzanne returned for more lessons in subsequent years, and participated in a few ASIA ski improvement clinics as well. She was still a novice skier when she volunteered to be trip leader for the 2006 Council Carnival to Telluride CO, and Suzanne has aided in the running of virtually every NPSC western ski trip since.

Suzanne's other favorite activities included hiking, visiting amusement parks, and kayaking. She worked as a data analyst for IMS Health in Plymouth Meeting for almost 14 years, but was most recently unemployed and in the midst of an active job search. A member of the Elks Lodge in Colmar, Suzanne was also active in fundraising efforts that benefited local charities such as Manna on Main Street in Lansdale.

A public viewing took place October 14, at the Huff and Lakjer Funeral home in Lansdale. Funeral services were held there October 15, with additional viewing and a service that was open for friends and family to share their favorite memories. Suzanne was buried with her parents in the Whitemarsh Cemetery, in Horsham.

## Ski Related News

**Mount Snow:** Snowmaking is of the utmost importance nowadays, as is being environmentally conscious. Mount Snow has upgraded its snowmaking system with 645 new, state-of-the-art, low-energy snow guns. This is the largest single snow gun upgrade in the resort's 60-year history, and was made possible by working with Efficiency Vermont, an organization that provides technical assistance and financial incentives to help Vermont businesses and households become more energy efficient. And, while not the most visible capital improvement, replacing nearly six miles of aging snow-making pipe over the last two summers will dramatically improve the system's efficiency and output.

**Elk Mountain:** Over the summer, Elk continued their tradition of making a good thing better. Their ongoing tree planting program replaced hardwood trees with approx 1000 white and Norway spruce trees, which add beauty to the slopes and provide a protective wind break. Elk has also remodeled their website ([www.elkskier.com](http://www.elkskier.com)), has done extensive painting including some lifts, purchased new uniform jackets for their ski school, built an additional parking lot and two new sets of stairs, updated rental equipment, and implemented a new software system in the cafeteria.

**Charitable Activities:** Each year, the Eastern Iowa Ski Club asks their members to volunteer either singly or in pairs for two-hour shifts ringing bells for the Salvation Army from November 12 to Christmas Eve. In July of each year, The Mogul Mashers of east Tennessee hold an event called "Captain for a Day" for the mentally and physically challenged adults at the Dawn of Hope day residence for handicapped adults. The club takes 25 residents and counselors to a nearby lake for a boat ride and picnic lunch where gift bags are presented to the residents.

**Vail Buys Park City:** After a wild couple of years of legal battles between Powdr Corp and Talisker Corporation over Park City's land lease that even put into question the resort's opening this season, Vail Resorts has settled the issue by purchasing Park City from Powdr Corp for \$182.5 million in cash! The purchase settles all lawsuits between PCMR, its owner, the Talisker Corporation, and Vail Resorts.

The acquisition brings PCMR onto the Epic Pass, which now offers access to 22 resorts, including the Canyons, Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge, Keystone, Heavenly, Northstar, and Kirkwood. Although the Epic Pass will be valid at Park City and most lift tickets will be valid at both Canyons and PCMR, the two resorts will operate separately this season. By the 2015-16 season, Vail says it will lift-connect the Canyons and Park City, creating the largest ski resort in the US.

## EPSC Monday Night Lessons

Each winter, club members can participate in Council's FREE Learn-to-Ski program, which promotes safe enjoyment of skiing and provides newcomers an inexpensive way to learn. Instructors are also members of EPSC clubs, are certified PSIA instructors, and they volunteer their time to teach.

Skill levels range from those who never skied to those making open parallel turns, and skiers are grouped into classes based on ability levels. So even "terminal intermediates" benefit from these lessons! Over the course of six Monday nights, students progress in a structured curriculum, building skills and confidence week to week.

Registration forms for these lessons are available from JoAnne Landis or via EPSC's website after December 1st. Current club ID **must** be shown, and participants must sign in at the front lobby registration table prior to each lesson. Lessons start promptly at 6:30pm, with registration in the front lobby of the lodge available as early as 5pm.

These Monday night lessons are held at Spring Mountain, and begin on January 5. Lessons are free; Spring Mountain lift tickets and rentals are offered at a discount. The program is open to current members of EPSC clubs **ONLY**.
